# QUARTER 3 SAFEGUARDING REPORT FOR CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE 2012-13

### 1. PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

This report provides children's safeguarding data and analysis and provides an overview of safeguarding activity in Quarter 3 of 2012/13. This data (except for the re-referral information) is shared with partners as required by the Local Safeguarding Children's Board (LSCB) performance scorecard.

#### 2. RECOMMENDATIONS

That Scrutiny Panel notes the content of the report.

#### 3. CHILDREN & YOUNG PEOPLE UPDATE

- 3.1 This report provides an overview of safeguarding activity in Quarter 3 of 2012/13. It aims to highlight good practice and identify areas for development/improvement which will be incorporated into delivery plans for the relevant service areas. The data (except for the re-referral information) is shared with partners as required by the Local Safeguarding Children's Board (LSCB) performance scorecard.
- 3.2 Performance continues to be good with targets being sustained in relation to the timely completion of initial and core assessments. The action taken to reduce the re-referral rate continues to be effective and the current re-referral rate is 17.5%.
- 3.3 There was a decrease in referrals this quarter (83 as opposed to 107 in Q2) The number of contacts recorded between October and December 2012 was 143. This is a 20% decrease from that of Q2. 83 of the 143 contacts (58%) went onto referral.
- 3.4 The timeliness of initial assessments continues to be good at 93.2% within 10 days in the last quarter. The overall percentage of initial assessments carried out within 10 working days (previous NI 59) between April and December 2012 is 96.1% compared to 80.5% for the same period in 2011/12.
- 3.5 All core assessments (100%) have been completed within 35 days. Weekly monitoring and focused action to achieve improvement continues to be effective.

- 3.6 The number of children subject to a child protection (CP) plan has reduced to 12, compared to 20 in quarter 2, a decrease of 40%. Of the 9 CP plans that ended between Oct and Dec 2012, none had been at least 2 years in duration (previous NI 64).
- 3.7 Of children with a child protection plan at 3 Dec 2012, the largest age group was 0 to 4 (5 children) followed by age 5 to 9 (4 children), representing 75% of all children with CP plans. 42% of children with CP plans at the end of March 2012 were male and 58% female. All 12 were White British.
- 3.8 The numbers of children looked after remains the same as last quarter at 25. Of the children in care at 31<sup>st</sup> Dec 2012, 3 (12%) were from minority ethnic groups compared to 1.9% of the Rutland population recorded in the 2001 Census.

- 3.9 The largest age group of children in care at 31<sup>st</sup> Dec 2012 was age 5 to 9 which represents 32% of the total care population, with 28% aged 10 to15, 20% age 16 and over and 20% age 0 to 4.
- 3.10 Of the 25 in care at 31<sup>st</sup> Dec 2012, no children had experienced 3 or more placements (previous NI 62). This compares to 3.4% reported for 2011/12.
- 3.11 All review child protection conferences continue to be held within timescale as are Looked After Children Reviews. We continue to achieve stability and permanence for Looked After Children.
- 3.12 There were 8 referrals to CAF of which 2 were referred by social care this quarter. The percentage of social care referrals that result in a CAF has reduced significantly this quarter to 1.7% and this needs attention. We are undertaking a project to improve the robustness of the "step up, step down" processes to and from CAF/social care; proposals are being finalised and will be implemented as soon as possible.
