4. BACKGROUND

- 4.1 The Rutland Water Partnership (RWP) was formed in 2000. It is a group of stakeholders in Rutland that meet quarterly to discuss matters concerning Rutland Water and the surrounding area, for example:
 - a) Leisure, Tourism and Heritage
 - b) Highways, Transport and Access
 - c) Environmental Quality
- 4.2 The terms of reference of the RWP are attached as Appendix 1.
- 4.3 Membership of the RWP includes the relevant RCC Ward Members (Cllr E Baines, Cllr K Bool and Cllr T King). Cllr Baines is the current chair of the Partnership.

Appendix 1

RUTLAND WATER PARTNERSHIP TERMS OF REFERENCE



- 1. The Rutland Water Partnership is a collaborative group comprising agencies, companies and individuals with a particular interest in the Rutland Water environment.
- 2. Partnership members will recognise and appreciate the statutory, regulatory, operational and business requirements of each other.
- 3. Decisions of the Partnership will not be binding on any member organisation.
- 4. The Partnership will have no formal powers and will act in an advisory capacity only to its member organisations.
- 5. The Partnership will specify the maximum number of representatives for each member organisation.
- 6. Meetings of the Partnership will be arranged in accordance with an agreed frequency.
- 7. The agendas for meetings will be determined in consultation with Partnership members seeking to achieve the group's objectives.
- 8. Rutland County Council will provide secretariat support for the Partnership.
- 9. Minutes of Partnership meetings will be distributed to all members and other organisations with an interest (unless they contain confidential matters).
- 10. The Partnership will have the right to co-opt other representatives as the occasion demands.
- 11. The Partnership will undertake consultation with any organisation or individual as necessary and will be available to be consulted by other organisations.
- 12. The Partnership may undertake surveys, studies or investigations, the cost of which will be shared between the Partnership members unless special funding is available. No commitment to funding is made by any partner.
- 13. Any member of the Partnership with the unanimous agreement of the other members can undertake press releases and publicity for the Partnership.
- 14. These terms of reference can be amended by the Partnership with the agreement of all its members.
- 15. The Partnership can be dissolved with the mutual agreement of all members.
