


# Rutland Council County Quarterly Performance Report

#### **Corporate Health Summary**





#### **Sickness Monitoring**



The average days lost per employee figure for Quarter 1 across the whole Council was 1.03, a significant improvement on Quarter 4's figure of 1.64, and lower than any period in the previous year.

There were 108 total occurrences of sickness during Quarter 1, from a total of 85 employees. 7 of these were long term sickness (defined as more than 20 working days), and 101 were short term (defined as 20 working days or less).



#### Improving Access to Services – Critical Success Factors





- CST figures have shown a slight fall, in comparison with Quarter 4 2010/11 and also across the current quarter. This is in part due to the increased number of calls historically received during Q1 for Council Tax billing and Direct Debit setup.
- The team also lost 2 members in February/March which has had an effect on resolution rates.
- CST have also been actively managing junk email sent to the Enquiries address. They have managed to reduce this from 1000 a month, down to an average of 380. Non-junk email remains steady at an average of approximately 800 to the same address.
