1. Opening Prayer

The SACRE opening prayer was given by Gale Waller

2. Welcome and Apologies

The Chair welcomed everybody to the meeting and introduced M.D. Primary Head Teacher from Exton and Greetham Cof E. Primary School.

The Chair reported the following:

- Confirmation was given that currently quoracy of meetings would depend on whether there was a member present from each of the four groups. advised the Diocesan Board of Education will be
considering the matter next week.

4.5 2013-2014 SACRE Annual Report: The compilation of an on line survey about SACRE to Rutland schools has not yet been completed.

4.7 Agreed Syllabus: Action Head of Service to liaise with Northamptonshire to identify their process for convening an Agreed Syllabus Conference to review the agreed syllabus, and identify how Rutland will fit in with this.

In support of the process AKG directed members to the Ofsted paper "Religious Education realising potential" and D.S. urged caution in waiting for action until post-election

The Chair would like a SACRE awareness raising letter sent to all Head Teachers; this to accompany the survey. **Head of Service to action**

The Chair asked for a report on the Short Course results from Rutland school. AKG reported that he had not brought the results. Action Short Course results to be circulated to members of SACRE asap and included in the Annual Report.

Chair to write to the head at Catmose about his school's results as soon as she receives short course results.

5. Development Plan

The Chair informed members that she would like the action plan produced at the last meeting to be agreed and actions embedded with ideas from members. It was agreed that:

- R.E. event to raise awareness be held Spring 2016
- Action Plan to be worked on at the next meeting or with an identified working group.
- R.E. Assessment

As a support to key actions in the plan D.S. suggested using the Ofsted SACRE SEF document as a starting point to the workshop. The key drivers within the action plan should have key impacts.

- The actions will embed SACRE within the Council systems
- Raise the profile of SACRE within Rutland community including schools.
- The outcome of the schools survey will also drive specific identified actions that will drive school practice.

The Chair circulated 20 ideas for SACRE to support further actions to see Appendix 1.

The Chair expressed that support may be required from specialist teachers and queried whether the Rutland Teaching Alliance could offer support to SACRE. **Action: MEB/Head of Service to make enquiries**
