### **Context, including links to Health and Wellbeing Priorities e.g. JSNA and Health and Wellbeing Strategy:**

This report presents the Community Services Strategy which was approved by the East Leicestershire and Rutland Clinical Commissioning Group Governing Body on 11<sup>th</sup> November 2014.

The Community Services Strategy outlines a vision for '*a fully integrated, co-ordinated model for health and social care, delivering seven day services, that puts people's care needs at the centre*'. It has been developed in order to:

- Agree and confirm a vision, service model and direction of travel to meet the needs of an increasing older population
- Ensure there is a shared understanding and alignment across partners
- Draw together all current services and plans that will contribute to delivery of the Strategy and start to identify the remaining gap
- Enable the vision to be articulated and communicated
- Support delivery of the Better Care Together 5 year strategy
- Respond to financial challenges and ensure value for money

Developed through a number of targeted engagement events, it is a high level directional Strategy, informed by published literature. It is intended that the detail that supports it will emerge following further engagement with patients, the public and stakeholders/partners.

Within this context, the Strategy provides:

- A vision and direction of travel
- A Case for Change
- A Plan on a Page
- A summary of the Kings Fund evidence reviewed
- A summary of the ten key components of care and 'what works' for each

component based on the publication 'Making our Health and Care systems fit for an ageing population'.
