To receive any petitions, deputations and questions received from Members of the Public in accordance with the provisions of Procedure Rule 216.

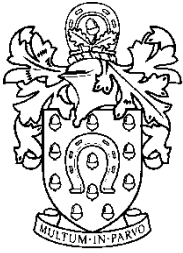
