Be 100% powered by renewable sources in well insulated and air-tight buildings. The energy consumption of all houses can be met with roof mounted PV panels and/or ground or air sourced heat pumps" Can the Portfolio Holder tell me the specific reasons for the Council continuing to allow applications for residential development to go forward for approval without imposing a condition that such premises are not heated either wholly or partially by gas.

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
