Oakham NP Vision Statement


Oakham will become Rutland's thriving and vibrant county town. Its rural location, rich history and culture make it a destination for all.



ONP and the Big Survey

What is Neighbourhood Planning?

- Neighbourhood planning gives **communities direct power** to develop a **shared vision** for their neighbourhood and **shape** the development and growth of their local area.
- They are able to choose where they want **new homes, shops and offices** to be built, have their say on what those **new buildings should look like** and what **infrastructure should be provided**, and **grant planning permission for the new buildings** they want to see go ahead.
- Neighbourhood planning provides a powerful set of tools for **local people** to ensure that they get the **right types of development** for their community where the ambition of the neighbourhood is aligned with the strategic needs and priorities of the wider local area.

Oakham and Barleythorpe Neighbourhood Plan


- **The Neighbourhood plan Steering Group was set up in the Spring 2016.**
- **It is a sub group of Oakham Town Council.**
- **The boundary was designated by Rutland County Council in May 2016 and encompasses the Oakham and Barleythorpe parishes.**
- **Consultation events held at Victoria Hall, TESCO, ALDI, The Farmers Market, Oakham Late Night Shopping and others.**
- **The Big Survey took place in the spring of 2017.**

ONP and the Big Survey

In Summary.....

- **Neighbourhood planning is a right for communities introduced through the Localism Act 2011.**
- **It has to be based on extensive consultation and a strong evidence base.**
- **The plan has to align with the RCC Local Plan.**
- **It will be voted on by the residents of the Oakham and Barleythorpe parishes.**
- **It then becomes part of the Local Plan and policies within them are then used to determine planning applications.**
- **It has real 'teeth'**



- **5,500** Neighbourhood Plan Surveys were delivered by hand
- Also available to complete online.
- **1,592** households and businesses responded (**29%**).
- Responses uploaded by Neighbourhood Plan team.
- Analysis completed by the **Rural Community Council (Leic & Rutland)**
- Findings published in the Big Survey Report **June 2017**

About Oakham Town Centre

You said you like:

- historic buildings
- local independent shops
- friendliness of the area


You said you dislike:

- too many charity shops
- difficulty in parking
- traffic in the town centre
- pavements being uneven and not wheelchair friendly

You have suggested:

- greener street scene
- wider and improved pavements
- more public seating
- reduced traffic and restricted delivery times
- more cultural events and festivals
- wider range of shops





ONP and the Big Survey

About Traffic and Transport

You said you like:

- to use your car to visit the supermarket, sports/leisure or doctor/hospital
- many walk to the town centre shops, school, nursery and playgroup

You said you dislike:

- lack of short-term parking in High Street
- congestion caused by the level crossing closures
- train and bus timetable/frequency is seen as a barrier to use.
- cycle paths with glass, spikes & hedge cuttings

You have suggested:

- additional long-term pay and display car parking
- a one-way system could solve congestion
- yellow chequer boxes at level crossings junctions
- electronic signs at the start and middle of High Street alerting traffic of level crossing closure
- more cycle lanes in and around Oakham

About Open Spaces and Heritage

You said you like:


- Oakham Castle, the parish church and the Market Place
- to protect buildings of particular historic or archaeological importance
- Cutts Close, the castle grounds, public footpaths and bridleways.
- to retain the open countryside between Oakham/Barleythorpe and neighbouring settlements, particularly Langham.

You said you dislike:

- use of green sites for building

You have suggested:

- to preserve and maintain the general townscape in High Street and Oakham's other historic streets
- better signage & information
- marketing the town better
- improving the heritage trail
- free parking for visitors
