PROCESS FOR S106 APPLICATIONS

STAGE 1: Identification

 Service provider identifies need and completes Developer Contributions Request form (detailing alignment to strategic priorities, amount of funding requested, total cost of project, delivery timescales, benefits and outcomes for residents/county) and returns to cil@rutland.gov.uk

STAGE 2: Validation

 Validation Application form checked for completeness – this is undertaken by Community Infrastructure Levy Team.

STAGE 3: Review of Strategic Relevance

 Strategic Lead requested to confirm that application aligns with strategic priorities for Alignment Council/County

STAGE 4: Decision Making

- Subject to confirmation that project aligns with strategic priorities, it will progress to formal decision-making in line with Council Constitution and Financial Procedure Rules:
 - Delegated decision to be completed by Head of Service for s106 funding £500,000 and below (Note: depending on project a formal Cabinet/Council decision may be required even if meets delegated decision thresholds)
 - Cabinet Decision for s106 funding £500,000 and up to £1m Cabinet report required by Head of Service but no delegated decision.
 - Council s106 funding over £1m will require a Council report completed by Head of Service but no delegated decision.

STAGE 5: Release of Funds

Subject to approval, the relevant service provider will be required to complete a funding
agreement detailing the benefits and outcomes expected – to be undertaken by Head of
Service and Service Provider. A project record will be established on Finance and
Community Infrastructure Levy/s106 systems – undertaken by the Community
Infrastructure Levy Team and Finance.

STAGE 6: Monitoring of Expenditure

- Annually reported through the Infrastructure Funding Statement. Service provider will be required to provide updates to inform the IFS and a project completion report once implemented.
- Sample audits may be undertaken on risk based/sample basis.

Please note that that there are different thresholds for decision making for the Community Infrastructure Levy.
