Storm Desmond power cuts

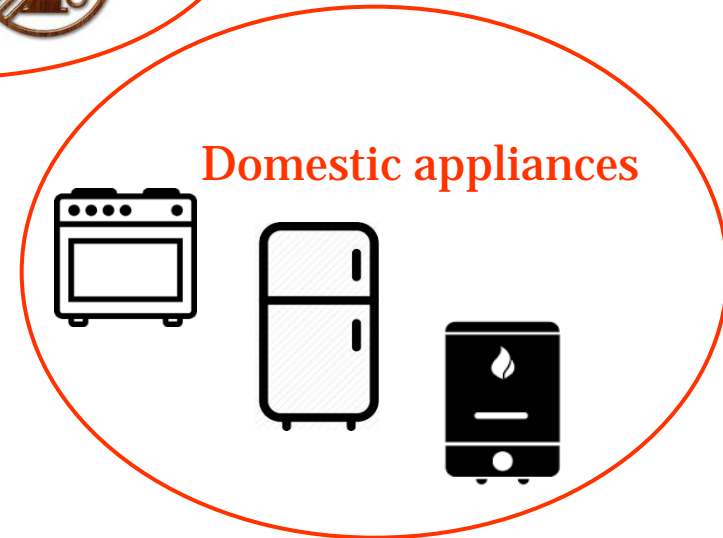
10.45 pm Saturday 5th December

Full normal provision restored Friday 11th December

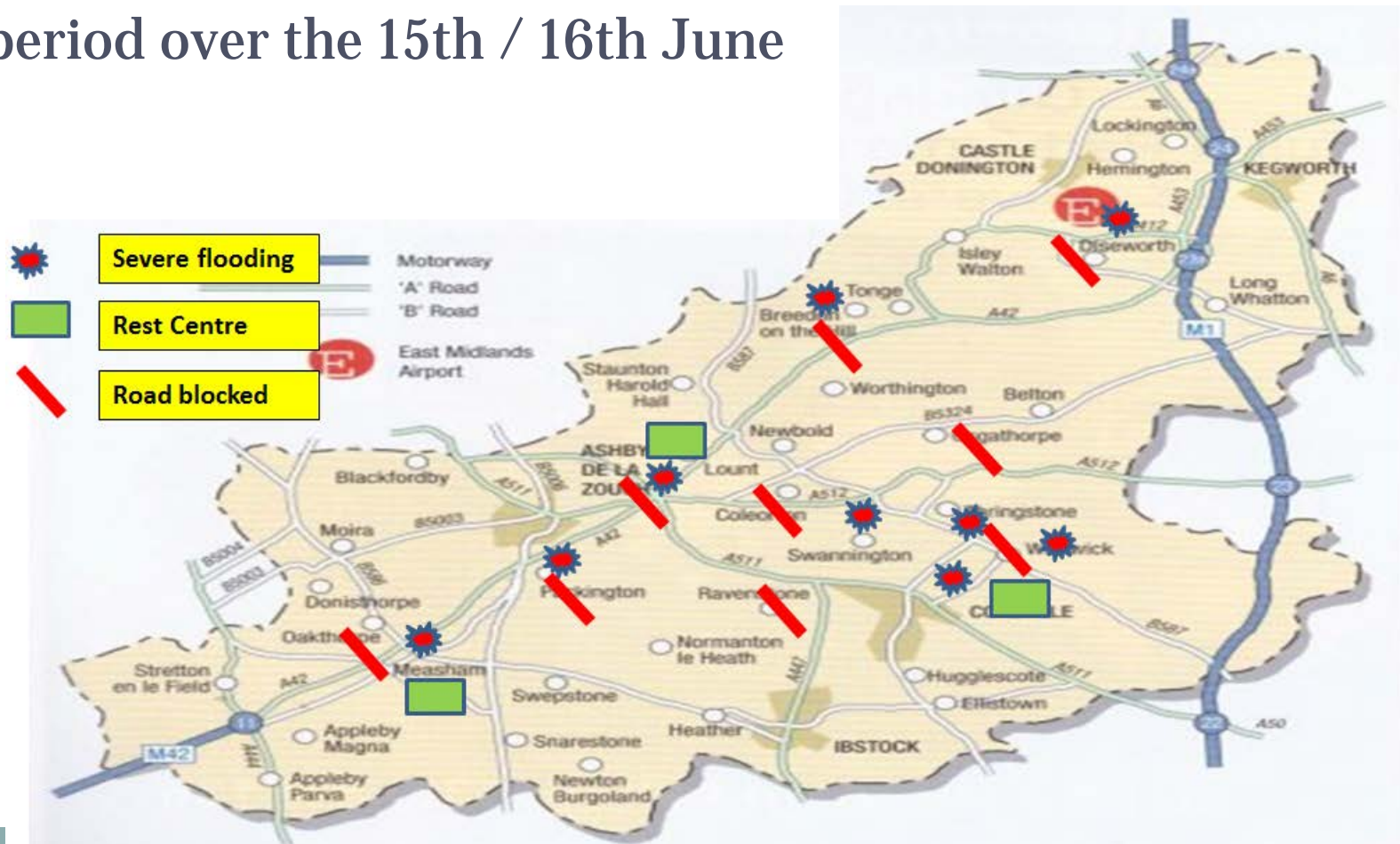

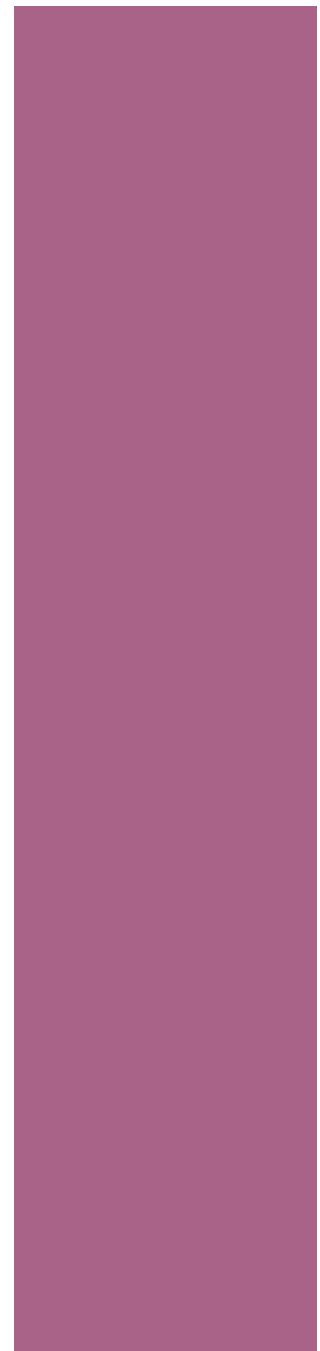
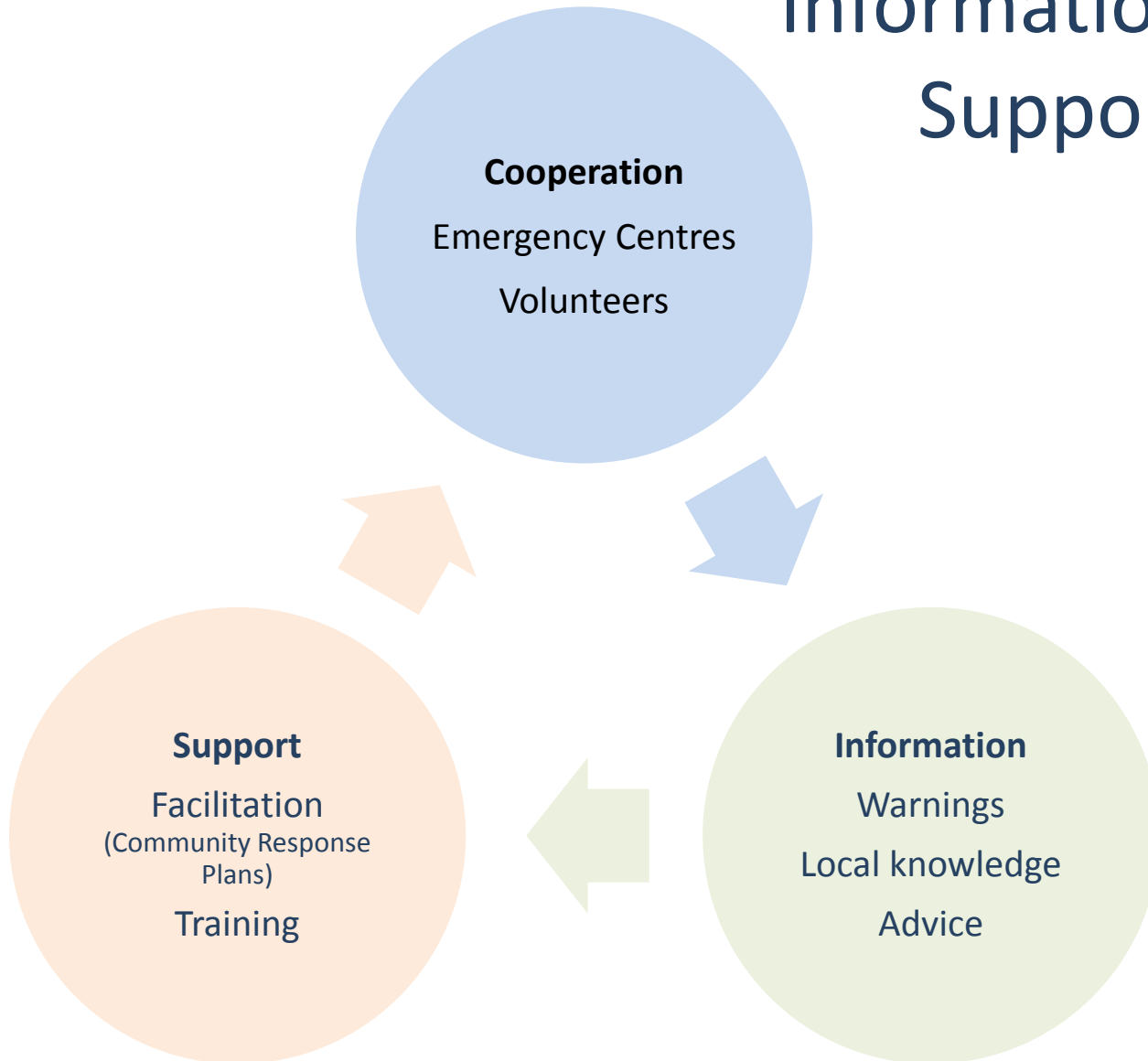
