Our Aims:

- Working together to ensure Rutland remains a safe place to live, work and visit.
- 1. Tackling the issues that cause the most harm to the residents of Rutland, with a focus on Domestic Abuse, High Risk Anti-Social Behaviour & Road Safety.
- 2. Adopting a localised early intervention & prevention approach to ensure that Rutland continues to be a safe place to live
- 3. Supporting the most vulnerable in our community and tackling the factors which increase the risk of victimisation or offending.
- 4. Accounting for Cross Cutting influences.



Anti Social Behaviour

- Anti-social behaviour is defined as `conduct by an individual or group that has caused or is likely to cause harassment, alarm or distress to any person'.
- Anti-social behaviour includes, but is not restricted to any of the following: Rowdy or inconsiderate behaviour, Neighbour disputes (not all cases), Littering, Dog fouling, Noise, Graffiti
- We have Anti-Social Behaviour Officers who are able to provide advice and support to tackle the alleged issues. They work with partners including the Police to find solutions to local issues.







Anti Social Behaviour The Approach

 - Acceptable Contracts
 - Enforcement
 - Referrals to partners and commissioned services

- Police and Crime Act 2014

 - Public Space Protection Order
 - Closure Powers
 - New absolute ground for possession

Domestic Abuse

- Domestic abuse involves the misuse of power and is based on a range of control mechanisms which include: physical, sexual, psychological, social or economic abuse or neglect of an individual by a partner, ex-partner, carer or one or more family members, in an existing or previous domestic relationship.
- Sexual violence is any sexual act, attempt to obtain a sexual act, unwanted sexual comments or advances, or acts to traffic, or otherwise, directed against a person's sexuality using coercion, by any person regardless of their relationship to the victim, in any setting.





Further Services and Vulnerability

- Alcohol / Substance Misuse

 Turning Point will work with
 anyone who is affected by drugs or
 alcohol and wants support to make
 change.
- Prevent
 - 'Preventing Violent Extremism' is to stop people becoming or supporting violent extremism who may be vulnerable.
- Child Sexual Exploitation
 - Children in exploitative situations and relationships who receive something such as gifts, money or affection as a result of performing sexual activities or others performing sexual activities on them.

Victim First is a support service to help victims to cope and recover from being a victim of crime (whether you choose to report it or not).

• Cyber / Online Crime

'Cyber crime' is a term used to define any crime in which a computer is the object of the crime (hacking, phishing, spamming) or is used as a tool to commit an offense (cyber stalking, hate crimes).
